In the past year, MESA organized various seminars, guest lectures, workshops and provided stage for students to interact with the industry experts.

A new wing of MESA, Website Development was established this year with the aim of encouraging mechanical students to involved in MESA activities.

With all other the activities MESA also provides funding to students for various programs, which includes publishing paper in conference, providing books for competitive exams, building SUPRA-BAJA cars etc.

MESA hoisted its Annual Technical Fest on 16th, 17th, 18th, & 19th August 2021. MECHKSHETRA-21. Under Mechkshetra, MESA hoisted a series of workshops on Mechanical Engineering. Graphic Designing, Python Programming, Manufacturing and CAD Modelling. All the workshops received an overwhelming response across country. More than 110 groups of students participated in the series of workshops. MESA was the first club in the college to conduct an offline event which was Treasure Hunt. MESA organized the event MECHMERIZE-22 which included small events like Bid-wars, Voice It out, Cadify, Business-Plan, Web lancers, Shutter Up, Placy-try. MESA also organized the event Youth Parliament for the first time in VIIT. Youth Parliament was organized with a view to make students aware of the parliamentary procedure and let them live the life of a Member of Parliament. The event longed two days and the event had received enormous response from the students

With the new set bar MESA team is set to give a bigger platform to all the mechanical engineering students next year.

MESA, the Mechanical Engineering Student Association, is one of the institute's most active groups. Almost any second-year mechanical engineering student at VIIT is eligible to join the MESA squad. Students gain hands-on experience on a variety of projects that aid in the development of particular skills and the ability to tackle obstacles, which MESA provides under the supervision of experienced faculty members. MESA is continuously involved in the organization of technical and non-technical activities and workshops that benefit students in a variety of ways.

The academic year 2021-2022 was a pivotal one for the team. It was tough to recover from the epidemic and come up with a hybrid (Online-Offline) solution, but MESA managed to organize and implement all operations under the leadership of the president and his staff. Our hosts, Gunjan Patil and Pranav Kulkarni, kicked off the session by giving a quick overview of the session and its significance. They also presented our main speaker, MR. Utsav Verma, Senior Project Leader at ATLAS COPAS, who received his Btech in Mechanical Engineering and Automation from MIAT.

Mr. Utsav sir began the session by greeting all of the kids who are aspiring to be future engineers. He then went on to explain what an engineer is and what mechanical engineering is. He also discusses how technology has evolved through the years, how it has changed, and what the future holds. In various industries, mechanical engineers are needed. He discusses the future implications and opportunities that this can provide. He also talked about the government's plans and ambitions for the future. 

### 1. Bid-wars






### 3.Cadify

- 5. AutoCad



The tagline of the event was "the only plan one can have." The detailed information about the event is as follows


- 1. The event was all about setting up a manufacturing plant for a sub system of cars keeping in mind what the industry and investors demand.
- 2. As manufacturing is a fast-growing industry, this event would have helped participants to make them aware of the automations involved in the same.
- 3. Participants got a chance to enhance their management skills by setting up a business model for the same.

Team of max 4 participants was allowed to participate and 15 mins were provided for each team to present their model. A Q&A round was conducted at the end of the presentation. Total 14 participants enrolled for the event of which 3 individual and 3 group entries were noted.

The students got to know about a lot of things as well as learnt from the feedback about how to deliver effective presentations and develop their presentation skills.

The 2nd Round was based on presentation. Participants had to present their work in brief (i.e., constructed website) to the examiner by sharing their screen to everyone. Participants had to


fill the G-form and submit their website folder. Time limit for warning was given to the presenter after 5 min. This round was conducted via Zoom meeting.


The competition received great response from the participants and a total of 49 participants enrolled for the competition of which 10 were individual entries and 11 group entries.

The last event of the Mechmerize was Placy-try which was nothing but a replica of a placement drive to prepare the students and give them some experience to face the placements effectively. It was more of a guiding event with hands-on experience. The event was conducted for 2 days in which 3 rounds were conducted: Aptitude, Group discussion and the last round was the interview round.

It was observed that participants showed great interest in registering for this event as it was giving the real experience of an interview process. A total of 58 participants registered for the competition and thus they began their preparation for the event.

Experts from industries, Alumnus and senior students were given the task of selection, judging and guiding the participants. The flow of the event was as follows-

The event was conducted for two days.

Day 1: - There was a session in which the expert guests guided the students to build their CV, aptitude round, group discussion and interview round in placement scenario. Mr. Ajinkya Shinde delivered a very informative session on how to build a resume, things to be avoided by actually presenting their own resume.


Day 2: - It included an aptitude test (60 Marks), group discussion (30 marks) and interview (Technical + HR) round (50 Marks). Those who scored highest marks out of 140, were Selected as winners.

Complete conduction of the event was done in online mode. The volunteers took utmost care to prepare the questions as well as deciding topics for group discussion and stayed active throughout the placement process.



One of the most popular games worldwide is the treasure hunt. The leadership of Mesa had its first offline event on a college campus.







MESA VIIT hosted the "YOUTH PARLIAMENT" event on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> April 2022. The event was held at the premises of Vishwakarma Institute of Information Technology, Pune. The chief guest of the program was Hon. Adv. Vijay Sawant (Member of Law Commission of India) and Adv. Shivraj Kadam (Vice President, Pune Lawyers Association). The event was organized to give the students an experience of our Lok Sabha and to give them an opportunity to express their views on some of the topics broadly provided by MESA and some of their choice.





The event commenced with the lighting of lamp by group of dignitaries followed by Saraswati Vandana. Host Miss. Aishwarya Vaidya and Mr. Tejas Nanavaty gave a formal welcome to all the dignitaries on stage and participants from VIIT and other colleges. VIIT students were also present to witness the inaugural ceremony of the event. Thereupon the Chief



Guest of the event Hon. Adv. Vijay Sawant sir delighted the participants with his golden words. He discussed parliamentary democracy, the type of democracy in India. He explained every line in the preamble of the Indian Constitution. He mentioned that he was astonished to see such an event being organized in an Engineering College. He commended the participants and

the organizing team for taking the initiative to eradicate the stereotypes of the people. Going ahead Adv. Shivraj Kadam sir wished the participants luck and advised them to rather than taking it as a competition consider it as a learning experience and a platform to express their concerns and opinions about the issues in India. Later the Head of the Department Dr. Dinesh Kamble Sir and Professor in charge Aniket Salve Sir spoke on the program and the work of MESA. MESA President Mr. Piyush Kale Addressing the audience, thanked them for their faith in MESA and for the large number of participants. Following this the president officially announced the commencement of the event.

#### Assembly 1

On the first day prior to the commencement of the session the house was introduced to the speaker Miss. Ketaki Phatak and the rapporteurs Miss. Akansha Sarode and Miss. Vaishnavi Kacchav. Following the attendance, the session was started with the permission of the speaker and the national anthem. The very first session of the day was the Question Hour. The questions asked in this session were based on the topics broadly provided by MESA, VIIT. In this session each opposition member had an opportunity to ask three questions to the Ministers. The main topics discussed during the session were fuel price fluctuations, increasing solar energy projects, distribution of coal for power generation, and building infrastructure so that young people do not have to look for other nations to find opportunities. The minister assured the opposition that he would approve the budget for the universities and hospitals in



the outlying areas and also provide a large number of scholarships. The budget for the health sector and the Central Vista project were also discussed in the House. FasTag was another topic that was hotly debated. There was some confabulation about the safety of women, punishment in rape cases and the time it takes to get justice in the courts.

The Second session of the day was the Zero Hour. In this session the opposition members had submitted their questions to the speaker before the start of the Question Hour. The questions to be asked in this session were not under any banner and were solely of the opposition's choice. The speaker would choose the question from the list of questions submitted earlier following which the discussions took place. Most prominent subject matters in this session were the cutting of trees, privatization of industries and privatization of Defence as well.

The Third session of the day was the Bill Reading session. In this session the ministers read the bills which were already passed in the Lok Sabha. The main motive behind this session was to give the participants an idea of how a bill is to be drafted as they had to draft a bill on the second day of the event. A total of 8 bills were read in this session out of which two bills were chosen for discussion. These bills were selected through the preferential voting process which was conducted through an online software. The first bill for discussion was "The Farmers (Empowerment And Protection) Agreement On Price Assurance And Farm Services Bill, 2020" proposed by the Agriculture Minister. The second bill for discussion was "The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation In Admission) Bill, 2006".

"THE FARMERS (EMPOWERMENT AND PROTECTION) AGREEMENT ON PRICE ASSURANCE AND FARM SERVICES BILL, 2020" had a central idea of maintaining a proper price for all the farmers' produce. Doing so will reduce the losses of the small farmers and maintain equality was the view of the minister. The opposition had some suggestions to the minister to which the minister responded with agreement.

"THE CENTRAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION) BILL, 2006" had an overall focus to provide for the reservation in admission of the students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Other Backward Classes of citizens, to certain central educational institutions established, maintained or aided by the Central Government, and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. After the discussion of this bill the speaker announced the end of the first day of the event. And the participants were informed about next day's proceedings and the bills they had to bring by drafting it themselves.

The Second Day of the event started with the national anthem and the attendance of the MPs. The First session of the day was the Bill Reading session. These bills were drafted by the Ministers all by themselves. The main idea was to form a bill on the basis of discussions done on the first day of the event. A total of eleven bills were read by the respective Ministers. The Ministers also gave a bit of background of the bills along with the brief description of the important clauses in the bill. After the completion of the bill reading session, the house had to decide on which three bills the house will be discussing later on. To select the bills for discussion the house decided to go for preferential voting. This voting was carried out on an online software. The MPs were sent a link by the rapporteur on which they had to give preferences to all the bills. After the voting had been done the results were disclosed and three bills were chosen for discussion namely first "Sex Education Bill" proposed by the education Minister. The second bill was "The Protection of Women and Children from Sexual Offences Act" proposed by the Women and Child Development Minister. The third bill for discussion was "The Implementation of Minimum Selling price Bill" proposed by the Agriculture Minister.

The "SEX EDUCATION BILL" focuses primarily on the compulsory teaching of sex education in educational institutions in India. The bill mentions schools having two doctors for this purpose. The curriculum should have an impact on the students and should be explained in a detailed scientific manner. People in India should also be made aware of the use of sanitary pads. The bill also mentions having two members from the NGBT community and trying to improve the mental health of students.

The "PROTECTION OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN FROM SEXUAL OFFENSES ACT" was dedicated to the protection of women from sexual offenses. The bill sheds light on the number of rape and unregistered crimes reported daily. The duration of sentencing of convicts was discussed in the House and it was also mentioned that the convicts have reduced their punishment by paying money. The bill included the death penalty for rape. Counseling through the media, manipulation of samples, public awareness in schools were some of the other issues discussed.

The "IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MINIMUM SELLING PRICE BILL" was proposed to provide fixed prices for crops and reduce losses to farmers. The bill states that the government will provide a minimum selling price for crops and farmers can sell their produce to private companies at those prices. The government will procure some crops to supply materials through Public Distribution System (PDS). Crops that remain with the government will be exported. The bill excludes Copra and Sugarcane purchases by the government, but they will still remain under the minimum selling price banner. Opposition leaders also directed



the ministers to make efforts to regionalize various committees as crop prices are also changing at the regional level. If the bill is passed, it will help small farmers get the same price, the minister said. It was decided in the House that the government will also look into contract

farming under this Act. Following this session there was Diplomatic Lunch, during this the MPs could unofficially meet each other and ask them to make changes in their votes and bills.

After the Diplomatic Lunch the MPs came in for the last session of the event, "Final Voting". In this session the Ministers with all the three bills mentioned the amendments they made in their bills after the Bill Discussion session. After all the amendments were done discussing the house was ready for the Final Voting. The house agreed on taking the final votes using the Vote of Hands method. The "Protection of Women and Children from Sexual Offenses Act" proposed by the Women and Child Development Minister had got the most number of votes with a total of 15 votes which was eventually the winning bill. The "Sex Education Bill" proposed by the Education Minister received 6 votes in total. And at last, the "Implementation of the Minimum Selling Price Bill" proposed by the Agriculture Minister gathered a total of 2 votes. The result for best was displayed in the house and the speaker officially announced them as well. After taking the feedbacks from the participants the Assembly was officially adjourned by the speaker.

### Assembly 2

On the first day prior to the commencement of the session the house was introduced to the speaker M/s. Tanaya Kulkarni and the rapporteurs Mr. Rishi Mutagekar and Miss. Anisa Diwan. Following the attendance, the session was started with the permission of the speaker and the national anthem. The very first session of the day was the Question Hour. The questions asked in this session were based on the topics broadly provided by MESA, VIIT. In this session each opposition member had an opportunity to ask three questions to the Ministers. The ministries during this session were the Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Rural Development and Ministry of Telecommunication. There was a heated argument between the opposition members and the Minister over Article 370. The Ministry of Education was asked about reducing the use of drugs near schools and colleges, changes in the national education policy and the fees & seats in coaching classes. The Finance Ministry was asked about the per capita expenditure in the current situation and before the outbreak of covid-19. The country's tax rates were also discussed. India's hard and soft regimens were questioned along with other topics such as coal shortage, Rural development and the religious songs played on All India Radio. The Ministers were also questioned regarding the 15<sup>th</sup> March Missile fire on Pakistan and were asked to share the technical issues publicly. All the questions were properly answered by the Ministers.



The second session of the day was the Zero Hour. In this session the opposition members had submitted their questions to the speaker before the start of the Question Hour. The questions to be asked in this session were not under any banner and were solely of the opposition's choice. The speaker would choose the question from the list of questions submitted earlier following which the discussions took place. The convention discussed the provisions made by the government for local artisans as their work has not received much attention since the outbreak of the epidemic. Some other points of discussion were the protocols needed to be followed by citizens to curb growing covid cases, communal riots in Delhi, India's role in Russia-Ukraine war, rising pollution levels, and the government's stand in providing subsidies to EVs. Few other points which led to heated debates were fantasy and online gaming, Hindu Marriage Code Law of Goa, recognition of deaf athletes as para-athletes, black marketing of remdesivir and shortage of ambulances.

After the break the house mutually decided to have an extended Question Hour instead of the earlier decided Bill Reading session. With the permission of the speaker the extended Question Hour started. The session began with discussions on topics such as All India Radio being biased, protection of Kargil's Shia Community's interest in new Buddhist majority region, Jammu & Kashmir being declared a Union territory, Clauses in the new education policy, implementation of Mother tongue as a subject in private institutes, lack of infrastructure in sports section, reduction in farmers' suicides, the debt waiver process and encouraging farmers to take seasonal crops. This was the end of the First Day of the Event.

The Second Day of the event started with the national anthem and the attendance of the MPs. The First session of the day was the Bill Reading session. These bills were drafted by the Ministers all by themselves. The main idea was to form a bill on the basis of discussions done on the first day of the event. A total of eleven bills were read by the respective Ministers. The Ministers also gave a bit of background of the bills along with the brief description of the important clauses in the bill. After the completion of the bill reading session, the house had to decide on which three bills the house will be discussing later on. To select the bills for



discussion the house decided to go for preferential voting. This voting was carried out on an online software. The MPs were sent a link by the rapporteur on which they had to give preferences to all the bills. After the voting had been done the results were disclosed and three bills were chosen for discussion namely first "New Education Policy" proposed by the education Minister. The second bill was "The Farmers' Empowerment Act" proposed by the Agriculture Minister. The third bill for discussion was "The New India Act" proposed by the Heath and AYUSH Minister.

The "NEW EDUCATION POLICY" Bill was mainly focused on reducing the gap between the current state of learning outcomes and what is required. The bill proposed Foundation Literacy and Numeracy: An urgent & necessary prerequisite to learning. The ability to read, write and also perform basic operations with numbers is a necessary foundation. Second the learning should be holistic, integrated, enjoyable and engaging. And hence the framework for school education will therefore be guided by a 5+3+3+4 design, consisting of the Foundational Stage (in two parts, that is 3 years in pre-school +2 years in primary schools). Experimental Learning will also be a point of focus for schools. Third point was Efficient Resourcing and Effective Governance through School Complexes/Clusters. Quality Universities and Colleges will be made easily available for the citizens. Re-imagining of the Vocational Education will be done. Promotion of Indian Languages, Arts and Culture will be done. Affordable and Quality Education for all will be provided. And the last point of the Bill was that the bill applicable nationwide.



The opposition leader asked the Minister about the reduction of fees in schools as well as private coaching classes to which the Minister responded that the government will be providing scholarships to students and will also consider reducing the fees of private coaching

classes. The Minister addressed the opposition member saying there will be awareness campaigns carried out to make sure these problems don't haunt us in the future.

"THE FARMERS' EMPOWERMENT ACT" was proposed to tackle the fundamental issues faced by agriculture sector in India including rural employment, reform, land reform, farmer suicides, food security, agricultural productivity, farm loans, irrigation and farm infrastructure. The first point of the bill was the waste land redistribution according to which the government will distribute the non-used lands to the farmers willing to take them. Helping employment as well as use of the barren land. The second point was Prevention of diversion of agricultural and forest land to non-agricultural activities. Third point being Promotion of non-seasonal crops through subsidies. Under this clause the government will encourage the farmers to take different crops to increase the variety The last point was to create an ecosystem where the farmers and traders enjoy the freedom of choice to sale and purchase of farmers' produce which facilitates remunerative prices through competitive alternative trading channels.

The opposition members asked the Minister about the help provided to the farmers in debt waiver. On which the Minister responded saying the government has already started paying the farmers and all the farmers will be getting their share this year. Also, the farmers' suicides were discussed on which the Minister assured to make reforms to reduce the number of farmers' suicides in coming years.

"THE NEW INDIA ACT" was an act to promote optimal population for future India by promoting small family norms of up to two children per eligible female, to ensure the prosperity of health, wealth, and well-being for each and every current and future citizen of India. The objective of the act shall be the following: To provide resources for the health, wealth, and prosperity of each and every citizen of India by making sure the optimal state of the population can be achieved, To reduce the burden on the limited economic and infrastructure of the nation, To establish India as a developed and healthy nation with strong internal and external security, To safeguard the interest of not only current but also future generations of India. The exceptions to disadvantages shall be provided in the following cases a) The parent has more than 2 living children before the passing of such a law, b) In case of birth of two or more children at one time. The opposition was not much impressed with Minister as they hadn't mentioned all the points discussed on the earlier day. But later on, the




discussion started on whether we should be considering the option of controlling population all of a sudden. Following this session there was Diplomatic Lunch, during this the MPs could unofficially meet each other and ask them to make changes in their votes and bills.

After the Diplomatic Lunch the MPs came in for the last session of the event, "Final Voting". In this session the Ministers with all the three bills mentioned the amendments they made in their bills after the Bill Discussion session. After all the amendments were done discussing the house was ready for the Final Voting. The house agreed on taking the final votes using the Vote of Hands method. The "New Education Policy" proposed by the education Minister had got the most number of votes with a full house of 19 votes which was eventually the winning bill. "The Farmers' Empowerment Act" proposed by the Agriculture Minister received 16 votes in total. And at last, the "New Education Policy" proposed by the Health and AYUSH Minister gathered a total of 12 votes. The results were displayed in the house and the speaker officially announced them as well. After taking the feedbacks from the participants the Assembly was officially adjourned by the speaker.

After the completion of all the proceedings of the assemblies, the participants gathered in the seminar hall for the prize distribution ceremony. At the beginning of the ceremony, the host M/s. Avanti Shinde and M/s. Vedashri Patil thanked the participants and guests for giving their precious time to the event. The speakers then announced the name of the winners from their respective assemblies. The winners from the assembly 1 were Mr. Alok Joshi (Best Parliamentarian), Mr. Prasad Gherade (Best MP) and M/s. Namrata Mali (Best Bill). And the winners of the Assembly 2 were Mr. Kaushik Munde (Best Parliamentarian), Mr. Aquif Shaikh (Best MP) and Mr. Amol Golhar (Best Bill). The Best Parliamentarians were honoured with cash prizes of Rs. 2000 /- each and others were given cash prizes of Rs. 1500 /- each. The hosts then officially announced the conclusion of the event.
